HIGH SCHOOL CHEMISTRY CLASSES:

(Prince William & Fairfax)

Sandy Kelly will be teaching classes using the Apologia Chemistry *Exploring Creation with Chemistry*. Sandy has a Master's Degree in Chemistry from the University of Colorado and a B.S. in Chemistry from Geneva College. She taught chemistry at the college level and has taught home school students chemistry and physical science. Classes will meet

once a week, for 34 weeks, for two and a quarter hours for textbook discussion and lab work. One class is already organized with STARS in Springfield on Thursdays (see www.starsloveslearning.org). There will also be a class in Manassas on Tuesday 1 - 3:15 p.m. A minimum of six students is needed to have a class in a particular location. The cost will be \$45 per month from September through May plus a one-time materials fee. Each student will also supply some household items for labs. World Geography

Ages: 10-13

During this full year geography course students will study the world through the five themes of geography: place, location, human and environmental interaction, human movement, and regions. We will travel the continents using the Trail Guide to World Geography as a guide. Students will make a geography notebook that will be a record of what they learned. There will be light weekly homework and four projects (one each quarter). Games, quizzes and tests will be utilized to reinforce learning.

A minimum of 5 students is required by August 10, 2010, for the class to be held.

U.S. Geography or High School Geography

I will also offer one of the above courses if at least five students are registered by the end of June. U.S. Geography is for grades 3-6. The cost will be the same as the above course and the time will be Tuesdays before the World Geography course. The courses will be written this summer.
